2. Members of the Public:

There were 45 member of the public present who were given an opportunity to speak in relation to planning application 24/03596/COU at which various issues were raised which mainly impacted on concerns about Highway Safety and Increased traffic through the village.

The issues included safety of children who access the school walking from the village, the safety of villagers and other users using the roadway particularly where there is no pavement, the safety of the junction to and from the village onto Caynham Road, No speed limit through the village lack of streetlighting through the village, lack of adequate footpaths throughout the whole of the village No through road through the village, narrow roadway, parking of other vehicles on the narrow roadway through the village, impact to the very narrow bridge on Caynham Road near the junction to the village, increased access from the junction onto the A49 and increased traffic along Caynham Road.

6. Planning Items:

Planning Application 24/03596/COU

Address: Agricultural Building NE Of Hindover, Huntington Lane, Ashford Carbonell

Proposal: Change of use of agricultural building (soft fruit packhouse) to storage and distribution (Use Class B8) (no physical alterations).

The Parish Council agreed to object to the Planning application due to the impact of highway safety and increased vehicle usage through the village the Parish Council also requested that the application should be determined by the Planning Committee if the Planning Officer was minded recommending approval of the application.
